# North Jersey Health Collaborative your health matters



- Since 1992, the Housing Partnership, a nonprofit organization located in Dover, has been the resource for home buyer education and programs in Northern NJ. Their mission is to strengthen communities by creating lasting and responsible homeownership through education and financial coaching.
- Specific services include: An 8-hour homebuyer education course (available in person and online), one-on-one financial coaching, down payment assistance via NeighborWorks America, administration of "Mount Laurel" affordable housing units, foreclosure counseling, and classes on a variety of topics (e.g., financial fitness, weatherization, "being green, seeing green," gardening)
- The Housing Partnership has partnerships with ~18 banks who fund the work and provide special loans for homeowners. They work to negotiate with lenders to make homeownership possible for clients who wouldn't otherwise be able to afford it -They have an open door policy and provide education and coaching to people of all
- -They have an open door policy and provide education and coaching to people of all income levels
- 18-month average time to home purchase for Housing Partnership clients (work on education, building credit, securing loans, etc.)
- <u>There are funds available to help people with their mortgages via NJ Home Saver and Home Keeper programs; deadline to apply is 12/15</u>
- -The biggest obstacle people face is the lack of affordable housing in Northwest NJ; people need higher incomes to make ends meet and to make homeownership possible

#### 6:20 Grant Applications and New Opportunities

- Proposal from Morris Habitat for Humanity (Rich Cooke)
  - -Morris Habitat is requesting \$1,900 to go toward the construction and installation of two "little libraries" (take a book, leave a book) in the 435. This idea came from the built environment/sense of community group. Details were discussed in the meeting, per our policy and the steering committee will vote at our next meeting. Contact Ashley if you would like to see a copy of the proposal.
- Opportunity from Morris Blue (Nate Diskint)
  - Morris Blue is now accepting applications for integrated housing in on Miller Road in Morristown for people with intellectual/developmental disabilities (more information at <a href="https://www.morrisblue.org">www.morrisblue.org</a>). Nate reached out because they would like to ear-mark a room (or respite care, we'd have to work out the details) for people currently living in the 435 who need additional care.
    - Spring move-in date
    - 24-hour staff in the home with regular programming
    - No formal diagnosis needed
    - Can potentially house those with disabilities who are currently homeless (question from the group)
    - Fees on a sliding scale
    - No inquiry into immigration status (question from the group)
