Warren County Demographic Profile

Warren County, NJ has an estimated population of 106,617 residents which reflects a 1.9% decrease from the 2010 Census.¹ There are an estimated 49% male and 51% female residents.¹ White residents make up a majority of the population (89.2%), with other racial groups represented as follows: Black 4.1% and Asian 2.7%.² Residents that are ethnically Hispanic/Latino make up only 8% of the county's population.² The median age in Warren County is 44 with 1 in 6 residents (17%) being 65 or older.¹ This percentage of older adults is 2% higher than the state's and higher than all other NJHC counties.¹ Within Warren County, 20.5% of residents (1 in 5) are children and youth, under 18 years-old.¹ This is less than the state average of 22.7%.²

Within Warren County there are 45,266 residences including both vacant and occupied.² Of the 41,667 occupied residences, those that are owner-occupied account for 72.3% of households compared to 27.7% that are renter-occupied.² There is an average of 2.5 residents per household.¹

Warren County has a growing population of highly educated residents with 35.9% of adults (25+ year-olds) having attained a bachelor's degree or higher compared to 36.8% of the New Jersey adult population as a whole.¹ This value has been trending upward since 2010. The median household income for the county is \$70,471 compared to \$72,093 for the state.² Despite this, poverty does exist within the county. Presently, almost 9% of Warren County residents live below the Federal Poverty Level, of which just over 20% are youth (under 18 years of age).¹ Approximately 1 in 3 (29%) of Warren County's Black/African-American residents live below the Federal Poverty Level; Hispanic/Latino residents also experience higher levels of poverty than the general population (16.6%).¹ In addition to these figures on poverty, 29% of Warren County households are earning income above the Federal Poverty Level but below the basic cost of living – they are considered ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, and Employed.)³

An estimated 9,915 warren County residents were born outside of the United States, 9.2% of the county population.² Furthermore, the American Community Survey has determined that only 2.4% of households are considered linguistically isolated – where all members of the household over the age of 13 years have some difficulty communicating in English.⁴ The most common languages in these households are Asian/Pacific Island languages and Spanish.⁴ This estimate is better than the state value of 7.2% and nearly all other NJHC counties.⁴



Warren County SocioNeeds Index

The 2017 <u>SocioNeeds Index</u>, created by Conduent Community Health Solutions, is a measure of socioeconomic need that is correlated with poor health outcomes. All zip codes, counties, and county equivalents in the United States are given an Index Value from 0 (low need) to 100 (high need). To help you find the areas of highest need in your community, the selected locations are ranked from 1 (low need) to 5 (high need) based on their Index Value.
