Most TA requests were related to OUD treatment (73%), as well as prevention (10%), recovery (6%) and multiple (10%)

Medication for opioid use disorder (MOUD) was the most frequent topic of the 101 TA activities conducted.

The most common professions among TA participants are physicians, social workers, and mental health professionals.

TA Request Process:

(1) Go to ORN website, (2) click "Submit a Request," (3) fill out the linked form, (4) Speak with Julianne or Emily, (5) receive services

Laura notes that mental health and substance (mis)use will be included in the community health improvement plan (CHIP).

A: The ORN has been available since 2018, and Julianne and I have been in the organization since June of 2021.

Q: Do you do any work with Human Resources in any corporations with employees who may be struggling with addictions?

A: We are working with an organization that is trying to develop their human resources department, so that is something that we can do, it is within our scope.
