- Brian likes the idea of a keynote/panel discussion. He thinks we should include someone who is willing to share their personal story.

John Troche from Blue Crest shared that he is a recovery coach.

Ashley Close from Blue Crest shared that she attended a CARES meeting for the first time. It's worth attending. I told the group that I recently connected with Alton and will attend a meeting soon (there has been conflicts for the last few months).
