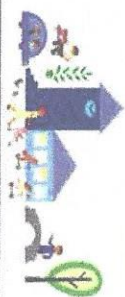

Discussion on strategies and rewording to capture the work we are doing and plan to take action on.

#1) Engage schools, youth serving associations and peer leaders on developing and/or deploying a comprehensive sustainable substance abuse program.

#2) Outreach to promote education about opioid prescribing laws and Narcan training to physicians, other healthcare prescriber, law enforcement, emergency responders and other community members.

#3) Create awareness of referral networks for substance use disorders among community partners and link resources through various media channels.

Final review and agreement to vote on next meeting to include all partners who were not in attendance. Need follow up to data committee via email with changes to strategies.

Follow-up and reminder for strategy sheets to be completed by each partner, as appropriate. Concern about data metrics were expressed and follow up with data on these will be send to the data committee for review and possibly asked to join our next meeting.

Other discussions on how to capture the metrics from different partners were discussed and how we can increase capacity to include law enforcement data and ED data.
