Laura O'Reilly-Stanzilis,: Executive Director of The North Jersey Health Collaborative

- The NJHC has pledged to include people with disabilities in all of our public health efforts.
- CEUs will be offered for CHES, Registered Dietitians, Social Workers, and Public Health. Public Health nurses are encouraged to attend, though nursing CEUs will not be offered.

 - The YMCA State Alliance has become a Health Equity Partner of the North Jersey Health Collaboarative.
- Update and outline of the Morris County 2022 Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)
 - The Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) was the basis of the CHIP.
 - Topics are Chronic Disease and Cancer, Mental Health and Substance Misuse, Maternal and Child Health, Healthy Aging, and COVID-19 Testing and Vaccinations.
 - The CHIP, as well as the NJHC, is based off of the Collective Impact Model.
 - The second survey that was sent out asks about *specific* interventions organizations offer.
 - Focus on Heallth Equity and Social Determinants of Health
 - Please share CHIP surveys with partner organizations

Da-sha Warren: The Partnership for Maternal & Child Health of Northern New Jersey, Premeturity Prevention Intervetion

- Reduce racial maternal and child health disparity
 - Black women are 3-4x more likely to die from preventable complications than their counterparts in New Jersey
 - Share educational ways to reduce stress, make lifetstyle changes, and ways they can reduce substance use and smoking to reduce their risk factors for premature birth.

- Eliminating racial disparities through community and education programs to medical facilities, faith-based organizations, fraternities and sororities, and other community organizations.
- Hosts Wellness Wednesdays to provide education and health resources regarding maternal/child health.
- Provides NICU kits to hospitals.
- Confidential "Maternal Experience Survey" on all birthing experiences (positive, negative; livebirth, stillbirth, termination, miscarriage), for a \$15 e-gift
 - Individuals can also sign up to receive results
