Maternal and Child Health 3. Mental health and drug use ▪ Disparities <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Early prenatal care for Hispanic/Latino women aged 20-24 is poor compared to women in that age group of different ethnic and racial backgrounds. - Higher cancer rates among men compared to women. - Extremely poor voter turnout in last presidential election. Only 65% of registered voters in Warren County actually voted. - Long commute time to work compared with people in other counties.
